My comments this week will not be the usual focus on philanthropy and Jewish issues. I am taking a different approach this week. I still want you to think about the power of philanthropy and please think about the Federation and other Jewish

causes, when you use your power of philanthropy. Today, I want to share with you a study that came across my newsfeed this week. The U.S. News and World Report's ranking of the best countries in 2022.

I find these types of studies to be interesting and this one didn't disappoint—I will leave a link to the study at the end. When one thinks of the best countries, which ones come to your mind? Of course, I always think the U.S. and Israel should be at the top of the list.

What criteria does one use to make such a judgment? Fortunately, we can dive into the methodology used to determine the ranking; it was published with the results. To cut through the suspense, here are the top ten countries in order of ranking by the methodology: 1. Switzerland, 2. Germany, 3. Canada, 4. United States, 5. Sweden, 6. Japan, 7. Australia, 8. United Kingdom. 9. France, 10. Denmark, and Israel came in 37th sandwiched between Russia 36th and Argentina 38th.

Now, the question, how were these countries graded? The research team of BAV (a global marketing and communications company) and the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania came up with the survey and the attributes and compiled data from 17,000 people across the globe ranking 85 countries. The 10 attributes used were Adventure, Agility, Cultural Influence, Entrepreneurship, Heritage, Movers, Open for Business, Power, Social Purpose and Quality of Life. A comprehensive explanation of each of the attributes is included in the study.

If we looked at any of the attributes and asked the question, where would you rank the U.S. and Israel? Examining and comparing the attributes of Entrepreneurship, Social Purpose, Quality of Life, Power and Heritage this is what we find: Entrepreneurship: U.S. was 4th and Israel 26th, Social Purpose: U.S. 18th and Israel 53rd, Quality of Life: U.S. 21st and Israel 44th, Power: U.S. 1st and Israel 10th (Israel's highest ranking), Heritage: U.S. 20th and Israel 34th.

Heritage kind of surprised me. How could Israel with a history going

back thousands of years be ranked below the U.S. More on this in future updates. For the time being, if you are interested in this study, please click on the link below and feel free to share with me your thoughts.

Tzedakah Fund by Alberto Tejero, CFO, JFED

The Federation's Tzedakah Fund dispenses financial aid to Jewish families and individuals in need throughout the Coachella Valley.

The Tzedakah Fund provides help (mainly) with utility bills and rent, to



a maximum of \$2,500 per recipient / lifetime. There have been cases in which help with dental work, local moving expenses, etc have been also granted. The needs and requests for financial aid may change from year to year. Each application for financial help is carefully assessed and treated with maximum expedience and confidentiality.

Our records show that 370 families and individuals have been helped since 2006 with an average of \$1,957 per recipient for a total of \$48,000 (average) per year but a closer look shows that the request for financial aid is cyclical and has increased dramatically in recent years.

The COVID pandemic, the volatility of the financial market, the real estate bubble, inflation and longer lifespan (among others) have been responsible for the lately spike.

The construction of an Amazon distribution center, which will bring needed job opportunities to the Desert Hot Springs area, has impacted the rent prices in the area with many senior citizens seeing their rent doubled in price and struggling to afford it.

We are grateful for all you have and continue to do to support the Federation's Tzedakah Fund. Unfortunately, this year 2022/23 we expect to receive an historical amount of aid requests. Your support is more critical than ever to ensure that funds are available to the less fortunate members of our community especially as we approach the Holiday Season.






Jewish Federations have raised \$73 million and allocated nearly \$61 million to NGOs in Ukraine and neighboring countries to support
